Stickydot is a Brussels-based company that shapes research and innovation through multi-stakeholder engagement and co-creation. We design participatory processes, facilitate dialogue, train researchers and science communicators, and work to make sure all voices are included when it comes to tackling the big societal challenges of our times, from climate action to public health to how science is communicated and understood.

We're a small, dynamic team working across a wide variety of EU-funded projects and beyond. That means no two weeks look the same, and interns get involved in real work from day one. Inclusivity is central to our values, and we actively look for all kinds of talent to build a diverse team.

What you'd be doing

We're currently looking for a full-time intern with a strong focus on **communication**, alongside support for trainings, capacity building, and project management.

On a typical week, that might include:

- Writing and scheduling content for our social media channels (mainly LinkedIn)
- Drafting blog posts, project updates, and other written content
- Helping to plan and promote events, trainings, and workshops
- Supporting the design and delivery of capacity building sessions, such as facilitation and science communication trainings for researchers
- Disseminating project results through various channels
- Assisting with project coordination and liaising with partners across Europe

- Attending events and conferences, with some travel within Europe possible

You'll work closely alongside our team of project managers across projects spanning science communication, citizen science, participatory democracy, and science-society relations. Day to day, you'll be working with tools like Mural, Canva, Padlet, Mentimeter, Todoist, and Zoom.

- Current master's student or in the final stages of a bachelor's degree
- Able to provide an internship convention from a university
- Excellent English writing skills, since communications will be a big part of your role
- Comfortable working across multiple projects at once
- Social media savvy, particularly LinkedIn
- Able to synthesise, organise, and present ideas clearly
- Genuinely interested in science communication, public engagement in research, or participatory methods
- A team player who's comfortable in a small, informal working environment
- French or Dutch is a plus, but not required
